



ROBIN HOOD FOUNDATION

The Robin Hood Foundation started informally in May 2008 and grew exponentially due to the needs of the community and five years was registered as an NPO. The Foundation has 3 major projects, namely – Days Bags, Love the Ladies, Wines n' Grapes & Grapes and Hope Breakfast (Cold Blooded Household). Each project done under the Cold Blooded Household banner is specifically aimed at explained and vulnerable causes and well-being of the Community/Urban is necessary.

NGO Data took Africa city further and have funded 11 facilities for the duration of the last five academic years, ensuring that not only do they have their school uniforms and stationary needs met, but that their home has the basic food needs met as well. We have annual visits with the children and this year we spent the Day of Black Town.



ISISEKELO PRE-PRIMARY

Isisekelo Primary School is located within Dondogweni District in Mthatha Local Municipality. It is a no-fee public Primary School. With a 20% growth in pre-school enrols, there was a need for Isisekelo Pre-Primary School to be opened to meet the needs of the community.

Nutrition during school years is crucial for the physical, mental, and psychosocial development of children and yet it is estimated that, across Africa, 22 million school children go to school every day hungry. Benefits of school feeding programmes on children and adults who worked with alleviating hunger, reducing malnourished children and women, improving school enrolment and attendance, increasing cognitive and academic performance, and contributing to gender equity in access to education.

This school wanted to improve the quality of meals by building a small kitchen where meals can be prepared by their own handsomeness ensuring they eat nutritious, balanced and tasty meals and feel good every day. These hot meals are frequently the main source of nutrition available to the school's learners.



REACH FOR RECOVERY

Reach for Recovery is an international, non-profit breast cancer organization that was established in South Africa in 1987. All Volunteers are breast cancer survivors, who have been through the journey of diagnosis, surgery, treatment and recovery.

The Volunteers are well trained and equipped to offer emotional and practical support to breast cancer patients and their families. Breast Cancer Awareness also forms a vital part of their strategy, as early detection is the key to survival. Reach for Recovery has breast cancer support Organisations with a unique focus on breast cancer support and are at the only organisations that provide a patient support service on a national basis.

This service is done at no charge to the patient and is available to any woman who requests it. Mammograms are a diagnostic life-saving tool.

The Early Childhood Development (ECD) feeding programmes reach approximately 120 000 pre-school children in 2 000 centres, operate in all nine provinces, providing children with a highly nutritious meal every school day.

The Organisation believes that hungry children cannot learn and without education, there can be no development. Daily, in South Africa, approximately five million children go to bed hungry each night. These children miss out on the vital nutrients necessary for their physical and cognitive development, which may have a devastating effect on their future. 80% of a child's brain development happens before the age of five, and adequate nutrition is crucial for mental growth. Without it, the odds of starving before a child and offed their prospects for health, learning and success throughout their lives. Nutrition is the foundation for children to achieve their full potential and the best chance of a brighter future. For Afrika feeds children to prosper and maintain the surrounding communities by increasing food security by empowering families and individuals.

Their programmes meet the immediate needs of malnutrition, and address development through multi-level feeding and intensive agricultural programmes. Their motto – if you feed a million you can change a child's life.

JES FOORD FOUNDATION IN COLLABORATION WITH SIX SOCCER LEAGUE

Six Soccer League is the community soccer league that was formed in 2020 with 100 clubs and the second season 2021, has grown to 18 clubs and this year 2022 expanded to 33 clubs. The league has a huge impact in the community and has a large number of supporters attending fixtures.

Focus is not only on football but also on the holistic development of youngsters in the area to build social skills affecting the community. They work closely with Communications Officer and Social Crime Prevention Coordinator of Hammarabate SAPS, as well as Crime Prevention Officer of Mjumbane SAPS. The league is based in Mjumbane Training and all matches are played at Goli M. Soccer Field.

The recruitment process is a three-step process with the following objectives:

- To ensure that existing and new clubs have the same playing standards
- To provide only safe, community-friendly soccer leagues
- To provide extra participation options to both recreational and elite young people in the area
- To ensure that recruitment does not result in a club, being open, closed or not
- To ensure that clubs are sustainable
- To ensure that clubs are supported by the local community, the local media and the local government to ensure that the clubs are sustainable, working with programs in the community to improve the standard of living, especially



EAST COAST RADIO

ECR's close partnership with East Coast Radio's Breakfast Team is helping with their 'Big Promise' initiative. The Big Promise is synonymous with bringing communities together to help make wishes come true and see that the spirit of giving, all its own.

ECR's close sharing with calling to social and has sponsored £70,000 to East Coast Radio and was able to social with their requests.



TREE

The Organization has been in existence for the last 28 years providing training and capacity development for the Early Childhood Development (ECD) workforce. Their focus is on empowering women from rural, marginalized communities.

TREE has training centers in Baso, Juba, Suddi in West Oromia, Lempassa, Gorkha and Peri Shegane and provides educational resources that are age appropriate for children to facilitate quality early learning programmes which are aligned with the National Curriculum Framework as outlined in the 2015 ECD Policy. TREE also provide essential gender materials and other educational resources to make educational toys that are inclusive for all children. These toys are critical for toy shop set premises, in the parks.

There is a diverse range of educational toys in the toy shop which helps the Organization generate income for recovery costs and sustainability. ICN-Erks worked with the manufacturer and retailer level of toy/shoppers and the toy workshop.



SOUTH AFRICAN BONE MARROW REGISTRY

Every year, thousands of people with leukemia, other blood disorders, and immune disorders reach a point where the only possible cure and their only chance for survival is a bone marrow transplant. Some patients will have a compatible donor in their family, but for most, they'll need a stranger's help, a stranger with their exact type of bone marrow tissue. Sadly, finding that match is just a 1 in 100,000 chance. For some patients they may have inherited such unique tissue types that they may have an even lower chance in finding a match and we will need more donors to find them a match.

The South African Bone Marrow Registry (SABMR) was founded in 1991 with a single intention: to save lives. As an accredited member of the World Marrow Donor Association, the SABMR is dedicated to helping patients in need. For 28 years, they have connected patients with their life-saving donors, provided support to patients and their loved ones throughout their transplant journey, and tirelessly expanded the donor pool to ensure that every patient seeking a transplant has hope to find a match, collaborating with physicians across South Africa and registering worldwide to search locally and internationally for compatible donors for patients in need. Together, they work behind the scenes so that patients and their families can focus on the most important work of all: the fight for their lives.

DOMINO FOUNDATION

VALLEY TRUST

The Valley Trust (VT) was established in 1982 as a socio-medical centre for health promotion in the Valley of a Thousand Hills (the valley) in the Dales West region of Ethiopia, (Bahir Dar). Its vision is to use health and other means to ensure that the rural communities of the valley lead vibrant lives as full participants in a democratic South Africa. In its long and distinguished history, VT has worked with local stakeholders to bring much-needed development to its target areas including the introduction of piped water, roads, electricity, health, and promoting the establishment of household and commercial vegetable gardens. VT has also formed strong bonds with local stakeholders and works closely with traditional and elected (municipal) leadership, local structures, government departments, and other not-for-profit organisations. In 2021, VT began an initiative to help households develop their own vegetable gardens in order to improve nutritional intake and reduce expenditure on basic food needs.

The vegetable gardens are established for each household and based on the foods that each household consumes the most. The year focused on training 12 VT staff members and 88 heads of households in what the intervention will entail. 2022 will continue the training and use caregivers to implement the knowledge gained through starting gardens in their homes. As at January 2023, 111 gardens had been established. VT works with agricultural consultancy GRCI Farms & Membership (Pty) Ltd who specialise in training small- and large-scale farmers to engage in animal production for domestic or commercial purposes. In 2023, GRCI began with training VT staff and selected households in setting up vegetable gardens. In 2023, GRCI will continue with training and providing membership and support to ensure the success of the initiative.



SA MOBILITY FOR THE BLIND TRUST

SBMT has helped nearly 8,000 blind and partially sighted people since inception in 1988. These include rural areas in KwaZulu, in Eastern, Western and Northern, as well as social schools for the blind. They have 11 training programmes in 8 cities of District Municipalities. They have a medical outreach approach, running programmes in areas that were under-served or not-served at all. Orientation and Mobility (O&M) teaches skills such as route-planning and orientation skills. This makes it possible for blind people to get about freely and independently without the assistance of sighted people.

O&M training is the key to day-to-day well-being of blind people, and promotes social and economic integration. The benefits are not only practical but also emotional and psychological. Activities of Daily Living (ADL) is part of orientation and mobility training. It teaches ways to carry out common daily tasks including walking, using a telephone, using an audio bank, recognising notes and banknotes, etc.



LUNGISANE INDLELA

In 2007 Lungisane Indlela was formed out of a non-profit organization called Indlela. The vision of Lungisane Indlela is to empower and improve the lives of the people and children of the Densel community, bringing them hope for the future. Their vision and mission is to see every child in a school or school to see the Densel children and schools transformed and reach a standard of excellence. To see every child care for their religious, emotional, business established within Densel, and to see sports, dance, drama, art and crafts introduced.

In essence to see that no one will be left as they develop a foundation work and play ethic. They believe that community development is the most appropriate action in essential poverty. Such development needs to incorporate the social, and physical well-being of each individual (holistic approach), focusing on the old saying of "teach the people to fish". As the African proverb says "It takes a village to raise a child". This means that it takes more than one person to teach a child the way of life. KCB Densel assisted the Cooperative with installation of an evening at their Densel House to create a space for the children to do their extra lessons, as well as learn arts and crafts and create things that they can sell and improve their circumstances.
